# Everything you need to know!

# LOCATION

- Summit is located at 2100 Reynolda Road in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

#### **CAMPUS SAFETY**

- All guidelines are based on our goal to keep everyone safe and happy.
- Please do not use your cell phone while driving on campus.

# MORNING DROP-OFF: 8:50-9:00 AM

- Follow the signs and traffic guides.
- Summit Summer is open for drop-off ten minutes before camp starts.
- Please drop off children from the passenger side of vehicles in the right lane only.
- Project Play drop-off is in the classroom.
- We encourage carpooling and ask that each car make only one stop.
- If you prefer to park, please escort children to the building using crosswalks only.
- Children of any age may not cross the drop-off lane without an adult.

#### FIRST DAY OF CAMP-

- Campers will gather in the **Summit Theatre** to meet their teachers and new friends.
- Parents may drop-off campers at the curb or park and walk to the theatre together.
- Exceptions- Some camps meet in a different location. Please see separate camp info sheets.
- Reminder- Lunch is included for all camps. You don't need to bring a lunch or a snack.

# AFTERNOON PICK-UP

- All camps have two pick-up options.
  - 1. Park and retrieve your campers on foot.
    - a. Drivers who choose to park in one of our lots pick up campers directly from the gathering area.
    - b. Please tell the camp teacher that you are parked in the parking lot.
  - 2. Wait for your campers in your car. See the Ferryboat System.

#### AFTERNOON PICK-UP FERRYBOAT SYSTEM

- Vehicles move all the way forward in two lanes filling the main driveway.
- Early cars must pull down to the Triad building, past the mosaic benches. Engines on or off.
- We wait to load until all camp groups arrive and are seated.
- We aim for 2:00 PM sharp, but may need to wait a few minutes for the all groups to arrive.
- Please do not signal your child to come to your car until we raise the LOAD sign.
- Then follow the directions as they are announced:

# CUT ENGINES

• Engines should remain off and drivers should stay in or near their cars as campers wait for the "Load" signal.

#### LOAD

- o Teachers will release campers who have seen their cars.
- O Campers who can't see their cars will be called to their vehicles by radio. Print, fill in and bring the pick-up card found at the end of this document to show the camp name and the child's name to the Summit Ferry Helper nearest your car.
- o If your camper does not arrive shortly, please ask a Summit Ferry Helper to call for him or her again.

- o Load and secure your campers as quickly as possible.
- o All engines in the ferry should remain off until the last camper is loaded.
- o If you have several young children to settle, it may be best to park and retrieve your campers at their pace.

# START ENGINES

- Once all cars are loaded, we will signal "Start Engines" and control the exit of vehicles and direct the entrance of the next round of loading.
- If a child is not ready for pick-up, then you will be required to exit with your ferry group. You may catch the next ferry or park and retrieve your child by foot.
- Cars located behind the traffic poles near the playground must wait until the next "ferry" to load children or go to the parking lot. Children may not be loaded behind the rear traffic poles.
- Please expect some delays on Mondays as new families learn our procedures.
- To avoid causing an excessive line of traffic on Reynolda Road during pick-up time, you may be briefly diverted through the Reynolda Church parking lot.
- If the main lot is full, you may use the lot across Kenway at Reynolda Church.
- Traffic Helpers will be on duty at all drop-offs and pick-ups.

# CARPOOLS & OTHER DRIVERS- SPOUSE, GRANDPARENTS, BABYSITTERS

- To avoid confusion, be sure to relay our procedures to any driver who may transport your child.
- Not knowing these procedures is the biggest source of frustration for drivers.
- Notes from home help us to understand carpools or any other transportation plans.
- Since teachers may be too busy to check voicemail during camp hours, share any last-minute changes with the front office (336 722-2777) by 1:00.

# BEFORECAMP (8:00-9:00 AM) & AFTERCAMP (2:00-5:30 PM)

- Pre-registration is required.
- Follow the signs near the flagpole to our Main Afterschool Room. Please do not park in the driveway.

#### NUTRITION

- Snack is provided.
- Lunch is included for all camps that stay past noon. Lunch from home is not allowed without permission from the camp director.
- Campers should not bring any food to Summit.
- Peanuts, peanut butter, almonds, cashews, pecans, walnuts, pistachio and other tree nuts are not allowed on campus.

# CONTINUING ENROLLMENT

- It is likely that some of our camps will remain open during the summer. Registration for open camps closes three days before the camp starts.
